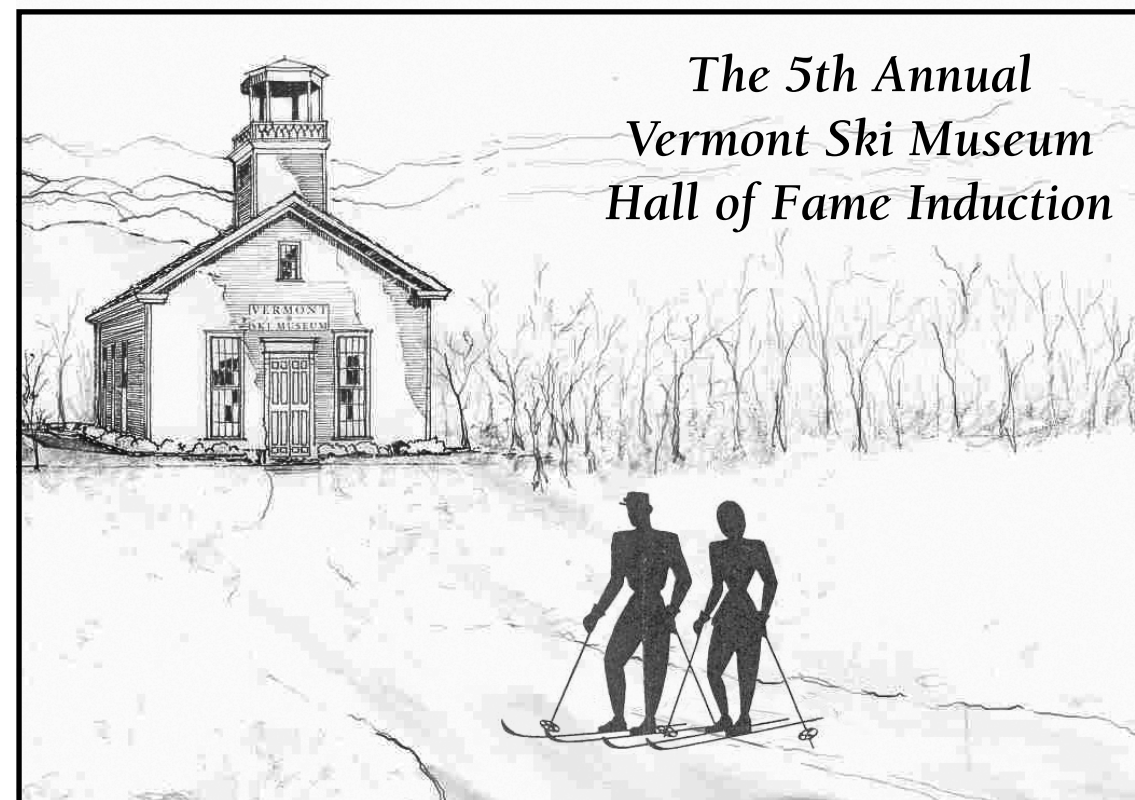


***The 5th Annual Vermont Ski Museum Hall of Fame Induction
honors the dedication and accomplishments of the 2006 Hall of Fame Inductees.***

Roland Palmedo, founder of Mad River Glen, began promoting skiing while at Williams College in 1916. He was involved in the Ski Patrol, competitive and recreational downhill skiing worldwide, and ski touring. Perry Merrill, the State Forester from 1930-1966, leased state lands to ski areas and used the CCC to build the infrastructure of Vermont's ski areas.

These pioneering efforts made Vermont a training ground for young stars such as Marilyn Shaw McMahon (1940 Olympian), Betsy Snite Riley (1960 Olympic silver medalist), and Billy Kidd (1964 Olympic silver and bronze medalist, 1970 World Championship gold medalist).

In 1970, Warren Witherell co-founded Burke Mountain Academy, and in 1972, wrote *How the Racers Ski*, revolutionary and evolutionary steps in racer training.

Take Interstate 89 to Exit 10. Turn onto Route 100 at the end of the exit ramp and continue on for approximately 11 miles to Stowe. Turn left at the blinking red light in the village of Stowe onto Route 108 (Mountain Road). Continue on Route 108 for approximately 2 miles - the Stoweflake will be on your right.
